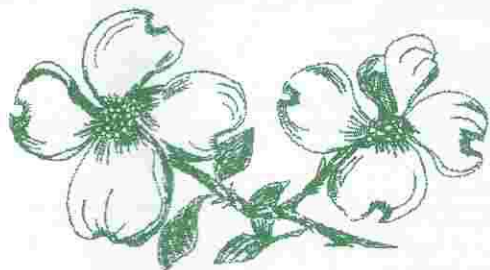

Special Program Notes

Meeting Theme

"Sexology: The Personal, the Professional, & the Political"

The serious study of sexuality is multifaceted. As individuals strive to more fully experience living, which includes healthy expression of sexuality, the scientific and professional communities work to more fully understand the phenomena underlying human sexual expression. In the social and cultural context, we also see the impact of our policy makers and leaders on values and laws pertaining to sexuality. This conference will attempt to examine and integrate these three aspects of sexual knowledge.

This year's meeting brings the Eastern Region's focus to the heart of the New South, a rapidly growing region of the country with an attitude of eagerness to grow and learn. Atlanta, the 1996 International Olympic city, offers its historically older neighborhood of Decatur as the location of our conference hotel.

The first week of April is Dogwood Festival time in the Metro area, and the pink and white blossoms will be in profusion. Moderate temperatures are expected as the beauty of spring in the South unfolds. The recently-built conference center offers a perfect setting for work and play, and is situated two blocks from the Decatur station on the MARTA rapid transit system's East rail line, with direct connections into and from Atlanta's Hartsfield International Airport and downtown Atlanta.

Decatur itself is a charming town with a fine collection of restaurants, nightspots, and historic homes and buildings. The hotel is one block from the old county courthouse and town square with well-lit sidewalks for strolling.

Awards Luncheon

The Saturday Luncheon (included in the registration fee) will feature a special posthumous tribute to Barbara "Bobbie" Boeke Whitney, Ph.D., 1937-1993, the 1994 Eastern Region Recipient for Outstanding Contribution to the Field of Human Sexuality. Dr. Whitney, a former Executive Director of SIECUS, was an active member of the Eastern Region Council and served many years as Treasurer of the Region.

Sunday Morning Breakfast

This annual event is a wonderful way for you to become acquainted with the Society for the Scientific Study of Sex, or for becoming reacquainted with colleagues. The Special Interest Groups (SIGs) will share tables during the breakfast portion of this event. Chat with SSSS members over a delicious array of foods. The "Open Forum" segment of this event invites everyone to offer opinions and ask questions about SSSS. Howard J. Ruppel, Jr., Ed.D., SSSS Executive Director, will be on hand to address the global Society perspective. This year, there will be a discussion about student interests. Attention to and discussion about these issues are a high priority for SSSS.

Student Scholarship Award

The Eastern Region of SSSS is pleased to continue its practice of awarding a \$200 scholarship and a one-year paid membership to SSSS for the best presentation by a student at this meeting. Criteria for the award and judging is the special mission of the Scholarship Committee. Announcement of the award is made at the Sunday morning buffet breakfast.

A Special Message to Students

Input on student needs and concerns has been incorporated into this year's meeting planning. Students may receive registration reimbursement by opting to work four hours at the conference. We have incorporated experiences especially for students, including awards, luncheon tables hosted by the State of the Sciences plenary speakers, and certificates for student presenters.

Special Interest Groups (SIGs)

SIGs generally meet at the Society's Annual meeting. The Eastern Region tries to schedule SIGs at the regional meeting as well. There are eight approved SIGs, including: sexual aggression, feminist perspectives, gay/lesbian/bisexual, cross-cultural, educators in sexual science, sex educators in health professions, HIV infection and AIDS, and students/young professionals. This year, SIG members will sit together (from 8:00-8:45 AM) during the first segment of the Sunday morning breakfast. Look for specially-marked tables as you enter the room.

Transportation

XA1872). **Amtrak** serves Atlanta from the Northeast and South via its daily service on trains Nos. 19 and 20, "The Crescent". (1-800-872-7245 for reservations). **Greyhound Bus Lines** serve both downtown Atlanta and Decatur (Atlanta station - (404) 522-6300; Decatur station - (404) 373-3213). **Auto access** to the hotel is via Exit #32 (Clairmont Road) from I-85. Follow Clairmont Road south five miles to the Conference Center. The hotel is on the right side of the road, shortly before Clairmont dead-ends into Ponce de Leon Avenue at the Decatur courthouse square. Parking is available at the conference center.

MARTA (Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority) serves the region with rapid rail and bus service. Fares are \$1.25 one-way for unlimited distance travel with rail service directly into the baggage claim area of the airport. **An optional MARTA TransCard for unlimited 4-day use is offered on the registration form.** The TransCard can be picked up either at the conference registration desk or at the airport MARTA station ticket window. Be sure to designate your choice on the registration form.

The hotel is located two blocks from the DECATUR MARTA station.

Workshop #1

Title: A Psychophysical Model of Healing Abuse Issues: Integrating Bodywork & Psychotherapy

Leaders: Robert J. Timms, Ph.D., & J. Patrick Connors, CMT

Summary: Childhood abuse leaves emotional, physical, and social consequences in adult life. An innovative treatment model integrating bodywork into the psychotherapeutic process will be presented. Particular focus will be placed on ethical and professional uses of touch with abuse survivors. This model of treatment offers the possibility of faster and more integrated healing for abuse survivors. Attention will also be given to the issues of various types of memories of abuse, including somatic (body) memories, and the controversy surrounding repressed memories will be evaluated. Case examples and illustrations will be presented in an informal, primarily didactic situation. Attendees are invited to bring questions from their practice. This workshop will be based on Timms' and Connors' book *Embodying Healing*.

In this workshop, participants will:

1. Learn the somatic and emotional consequences of childhood trauma and abuse.
2. Learn a new treatment approach to therapy with adult survivors of childhood abuse.
3. Review the literature on the use of professional touch in therapeutic treatment.
4. Identify and understand the important ethical, boundary, and professional issues involved in therapeutic touch with clients.
5. Be able to identify five types of memory of childhood trauma, including somatic (body) memory, and learn appropriate techniques of facilitating therapeutic recall of such memories.
6. Explore the current controversy surrounding the so-called "repressed memory syndrome" and be able to develop an informed personal opinion based on a thorough and scholarly review of scientific literature and professional practice.

Title: Emerging Concepts in Gender Dysphoria: Moving Away From the Stereotypes

Leaders: Dallas Denny, M.A., & Tim Schnabel, M.A.

Summary: Since 1952, when Christine Jorgensen's "sex change" was nationally publicized, increasing numbers of American men and women have requested sex reassignment. The treatment community which initially arose focused on surgical change of the genitalia in highly medicalized settings. Since the collapse of more than forty research-based gender clinics in the 1980s, a grassroots community of support groups and private practitioners has grown. This community is less focused on surgery, and is beginning to emphasize transgender identity rather than "passing" as a member of either gender.

In this workshop, participants will:

1. Learn the developmental course, characteristics, and needs of persons with gender identity disorders.
2. Learn DSM III-R and proposed DSM IV diagnostic criteria for gender identity disorders and identify various treatment methods and standards of care.
3. Understand emerging consumer-based sensibilities which de-emphasize medical interventions like genital surgery and "passing" in favor of identity as a transgendered person.
4. Interact with a panel of persons who identify as transgendered, learning to identify them as individual human beings rather than as media-inspired stereotypes.

Title: Vulvodynia: "It's Not All in Your Head"

Leaders: Sally T. Lehr, M.N., R.N., & Kim D. Jones, M.N.

Summary: Vulvodynia, chronic vulvar discomfort often characterized by the patient's complaints of burning, stinging, irritation, or rawness, has been recorded for centuries. As a clinical entity, however, the condition was first defined in 1982 by the International Society for the Study of Vulvar Disease. While many health care professionals of all disciplines remain unaware of its existence, vulvodynia affects at least 200,000 women in the United States and is being discussed in today's lay literature. Sex therapists in increasing numbers are being called on to be familiar with the condition and to deal with the assessment and treatment of sexual complaints and relationship problems which often accompany the condition. Didactic information and case examples will be presented, and discussion of intervention strategies by workshop participants will be encouraged.

In this workshop, participants will:

1. Define vulvodynia.
2. Discuss physical causes of vulvodynia.
3. Discuss psychological issues associated with vulvodynia.
4. Discuss sexual issues and responses associated with vulvodynia.
5. Discuss therapist interventions in vulvodynia.

Title: Eroticizing Safer Sex Part Deux: Negotiating for VENIS (Very Erotic Non-Insertive Sex)

Leaders: Laura Berman, M.A., & José Nanin, M.A.

Summary: "Eroticizing Safer Sex: Non-Penetrative Alternatives" was presented at the 1993 Annual Conference in Chicago. If you enjoyed this workshop, you'll LOVE this follow-up. HIV/AIDS educators and counselors who work with adolescents and wish to be exposed to educational possibilities around VENIS (Very Erotic Non-Insertive Sex) behaviors will move beyond providing information to begin enhancing negotiation abilities for VENIS behaviors. By acknowledging adolescent sexuality, and realistically addressing development-specific barriers to negotiating for VENIS, we can better help young people to experience their adolescence in a healthy, responsible, and erotic way. Let's teach our students and clients mechanisms for living safely by moving beyond intercourse to "turn foreplay into a home run!"

In this workshop, participants will:

1. Broaden their perceptions of sexuality beyond intercourse to consider VENIS (Very Erotic Non-Insertive Sex) as an exciting option.
2. Explore adolescent psychosocial issues connected to engaging in VENIS as an erotic behavior.
3. Consider lack of information and logistics; body image and self-esteem; social pressure and infallibility and immorality as barriers inhibiting adolescents' ability to negotiate for VENIS with partners.
4. Attain mechanisms for combatting barriers for lack of information and logistics; body image and self-esteem; social pressure and infallibility and immorality to enhance clients'/students' ability to negotiate with partners for VENIS.

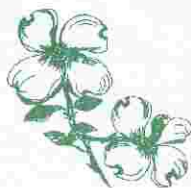

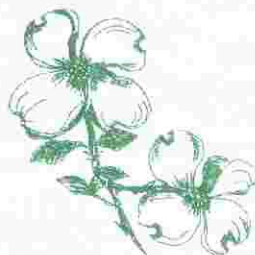
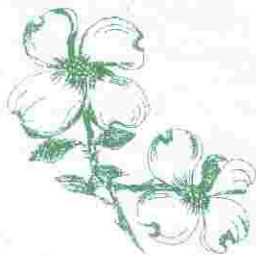
