

HOW TO TURN YOUR COMMODORE 64 INTO AN IBM-PC

Let's face it. You would have bought an IBM PC if you had had the money. Well, now there is a way to turn your C-64 into a PC in 9 easy steps:

- 60 to a hardware store and buy a spray can of white paint and a can of spackle. Go around to the back of the store and get a cardboard box.
